Dan Hilliard, of W.A.R. (Withlacoochee Aquatic Restoration) spoke to the Board of a report on the environmental assessment of the Lower Withlacoochee River. He stated copies had been forwarded to all State and Federal agencies. He made a request to the Board for consideration of a Resolution in support of a mediation for the restoration of Lower Withlacoochee River with State and Federal officials.

B. <u>Public Hearing</u> – Requesting Board approval of Petition No. SEA 22-01 amending SEA 01-20: Joseph Florentine, II, owner of Florentine Recreation, LLC, petitioning the Board for a special Exception Amendment, requesting an extension of one year to meet the terms of the SEA 01-20 on 12.23 acres of land in Sections 35 and 36, Township 14, Range 13, in Levy County, Florida. This parcel is located in a Forestry/Rural Residential (F/RR) Land Use and Zoning district. Parcel Number 0029300300.

Comm. Rock Meeks asked if anyone in the audience wished to speak for or against the item presented. Atty. Norm Fugate spoke on behalf of the petitioners.

#### DEPARTMENT REPORTS

#### DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

Mitch Harrell, Director

A. Requesting Board approval to purchase two (2) ambulances from ETR based on Florida Sheriff's Contract Bid Pricing for a total cost of \$602,266. Mr. Harrell stated his request is more for direction rather than approval to purchase and is looking to lock in on the price for the two ambulances, as the cost will rise as time passes.

Jared Blanton spoke explaining the complications with expending funds from a future budget year and stated this is not a budgeted expense for the current budget year. He stated locking in on the price rather than expending actual funds is a better option.

Following discussion, Comm. John Meeks made a motion to give direction for Chief Harrell to explore purchase options for two (2) ambulances as requested, consult with Mr. Blanton for recommendation, and to come back to the Board with his recommendation. Second was made by Comm. Brooks and the MOTION CARRIES.

- B. Chief Harrell gave a presentation of the LCDPS Report for CY2021.
- C. Chief Harrell presented and requested Board approval of the FY2021 fourth quarter write-off's as well as the FY2022 first and second quarter write-off's to the Board for approval as listed below:

Comm. Brooks spoke to the Board of a recent visit by Governor DeSantis to Levy County and of funding to be given by the State for Bird Creek Boat Ramp improvements.

Comm. John Meeks also spoke of meeting Governor DeSantis and of the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council meeting he attended last Thursday. Comm. John Meeks reported of the Wild Hog Canoe/Kayak race held recently stating it was a great success and well attended.

Wilbur Dean spoke of a Broadband Survey link sent out to parents of children in Levy County Schools and encouraged everyone to complete the survey.
