<u>Comm. Rooks</u> spoke of the proposed changes to US HWY 19 at the intersection of NW 140th Street, North of Chiefland. Comm. Rooks stated she expressed her concerns to FDOT of the emergency vehicles crossing US HWY 19, as the proposed changes will create longer response times for response to emergency calls.

Comm. Rooks then made a motion to have a letter prepared to send to FDOT encouraging them to add a traffic light to the intersection of US HWY 19 and NW 140th Street, instead of the proposed change to the median. Second was made by Comm. John Meeks and the MOTION CARRIES.

<u>Comm. Brooks</u> stated the Chiefland Watermelon Parade and Festival was well attended. Comm. Brooks announced the Williston for the Independence Day Celebration will take place on July 2nd beginning with the parade at 5:00 P.M., followed by fireworks at Horseman's Park at dark.

<u>Comm. John Meeks</u> stated there would be a Flag Day Ceremony on June 14th on the lawn in front of the Board of County Commissioners' Annex location.

Stacey Hectus spoke to the Board inquiring if they wished to have the next Farmland Preservation Workshop on August 2nd, beginning at 6:00 P.M. This date and time was agreed upon by the Commissioners. Mrs. Hectus encouraged the Commissioners to contact her office with names of any they wished to invite.
