DEPARTMENT REPORTS COUNTY COORDINATOR

Wilbur Dean

A. Requesting Board approval of the Lease Agreement between Levy County and Hudson Properties. The total rent, which includes base rent, common area maintenance, utilities, cleaning, supplies, and maintenance and real estate taxes, is \$2,002.48 per month. The term of the agreement is from October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023.

Comm. John Meeks made a motion to approve the Lease Agreement with Hudson Properties as presented. Second was made by Comm. Brooks and the MOTION CARRIES.

B. Requesting Board approval of the Ninth Amendment to the Three-Party Agreement between Levy County and the University of Florida Board of Trustees and William F. Hamilton, M.D. for District Medical Examiner Services, University Physician Support Services, University Non-Physician Support Services and facility use for Fiscal Year 2023. The cost of this agreement is \$114,032.76.

Comm. John Meeks made a motion to approve the Ninth Amendment to the Three-Party Agreement as presented. Second was made by Comm. Brooks and the MOTION CARRIES.

C. Requesting Board approval of the Contract between Levy County and the State of Florida Department of Health for the operation of the Levy County Health Department for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. The cost of this agreement for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is \$165,500.

Comm. Rooks made a motion to approve the Contract with the State of Florida Department of Health as presented. Second was made by Comm. Brooks and the MOTION CARRIES.

D. Requesting Board approval of the Agreement between Levy County and Meridian Behavioral Healthcare, Inc., for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. The cost for this agreement for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is \$88,660.

Comm. Brooks made a motion to approve the Agreement with Meridian Behavioral Healthcare, Inc. as presented. Second was made by Comm. Rooks and the MOTION CARRIES. Comm. John Meeks voted NO.

E. Requesting Board approval of the Agreement between Levy County and the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council for Local Government Comprehensive Planning Services for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. The fixed cost for these services for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is \$13,000.

Comm. John Meeks made a motion to approve the Agreement with the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council as presented. Second was made by Comm. Brooks and the MOTION CARRIES.

F. Requesting Board approval of the Agreement between Levy County and the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council for Annual Monitoring of Hazardous Waste Generators for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. The fixed cost for these services for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 is \$16,500.

Comm. John Meeks made a motion to approve the Agreement with the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council as presented. Second was made by Comm. Brooks and the MOTION CARRIES.

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Comm. John Meeks reported of the Economic Development trip he took to Thomasville, AL along with officials from Gilchrist and Dixie Counties. The Mayor of Thomasville shared with them Economic Development strategies implemented and successful in his City.

Comm. Brooks thanked staff for all their work before and after the emergency created by Hurricane Ian. Both the Peanut Festival in Williston and the Seafood Festival in Cedar Key have been rescheduled for Saturday, October 15th.

Comm. Rock Meeks spoke of 36 acres in Otter Creek where the County stores rock. He stated it could be available for purchase and inquired if the Commissioners were interested. The Commissioners agreed by consensus to direct Mr. Dean to explore this purchase for the county. Mr. Dean stated the property was in a central location within the county and could be used for an EMS/Fire station.

WHO MUST FILE FORM 8B

This form is for use by any person serving at the county, city, or other local level of government on an appointed or elected board, council, commission, authority, or committee. It applies to members of advisory and non-advisory bodies who are presented with a voting conflict of interest under Section 112.3143, Florida Statutes.

Your responsibilities under the law when faced with voting on a measure in which you have a conflict of interest will vary greatly depending on whether you hold an elective or appointive position. For this reason, please pay close attention to the instructions on this form before completing and filing the form.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 112.3143, FLORIDA STATUTES

A person holding elective or appointive county, municipal, or other local public office MUST ABSTAIN from voting on a measure which would inure to his or her special private gain or loss. Each elected or appointed local officer also MUST ABSTAIN from knowingly voting on a measure which would inure to the special gain or loss of a principal (other than a government agency) by whom he or she is retained (including the parent, subsidiary, or sibling organization of a principal by which he or she is retained); to the special private gain or loss of a business associate. Commissioners of community redevelopment agencies (CRAs) under Sec. 163.356 or 163.357, F.S., and officers of independent special tax districts elected on a one-acre, one-vote basis are not prohibited from voting in that capacity.

For purposes of this law, a "relative" includes only the officer's father, mother, son, daughter, husband, wife, brother, sister, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, and daughter-in-law. A "business associate" means any person or entity engaged in or carrying on a business enterprise with the officer as a partner, joint venturer, coowner of property, or corporate shareholder (where the shares of the corporation are not listed on any national or regional stock exchange).

ELECTED OFFICERS:

In addition to abstaining from voting in the situations described above, you must disclose the conflict:

PRIOR TO THE VOTE BEING TAKEN by publicly stating to the assembly the nature of your interest in the measure on which you are abstaining from voting; and

WITHIN 15 DAYS AFTER THE VOTE OCCURS by completing and filing this form with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who should incorporate the form in the minutes.

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APPOINTED OFFICERS:

Although you must abstain from voting in the situations described above, you are not prohibited by Section 112.3143 from otherwise participating in these matters. However, you must disclose the nature of the conflict before making any attempt to influence the decision, whether orally or in writing and whether made by you or at your direction.

IF YOU INTEND TO MAKE ANY ATTEMPT TO INFLUENCE THE DECISION PRIOR TO THE MEETING AT WHICH THE VOTE WILL BE TAKEN:

You must complete and file this form (before making any attempt to influence the decision) with the person responsible for recording the
minutes of the meeting, who will incorporate the form in the minutes. (Continued on page 2)
